COLLECTED PAPERS OF JOHN N. HAZARD, Nash Professor Emeritus of Public Law, Columbia University.

More than 200 articles, reviews, and teaching manuals (most books are not included in this set, but will be offered individually) published since 1936 on Soviet law, the family of socialist legal systems, aspects of international law, international trade and arbitration, and comparative law. A substantial bibliography of the author's publications is included in the set.

COLLECTED PAPERS OF RUDOLF SCHLESINGER, formerly Director of the Institute of Soviet and East European Studies, University of Glasgow.

Contains ca. 150 books, articles, and reviews, and a fascinating body of previously unpublished memoirs, lectures, and books in progress. Schlesinger (1901-69) was active in the Comintern until 1937, and after the Second World War played a leading role in developing Soviet legal studies in Britain. Also included in the microfiche edition are letters from the Schlesinger archive for the period 1938-65. A full bibliography of all writings is included in the set.
