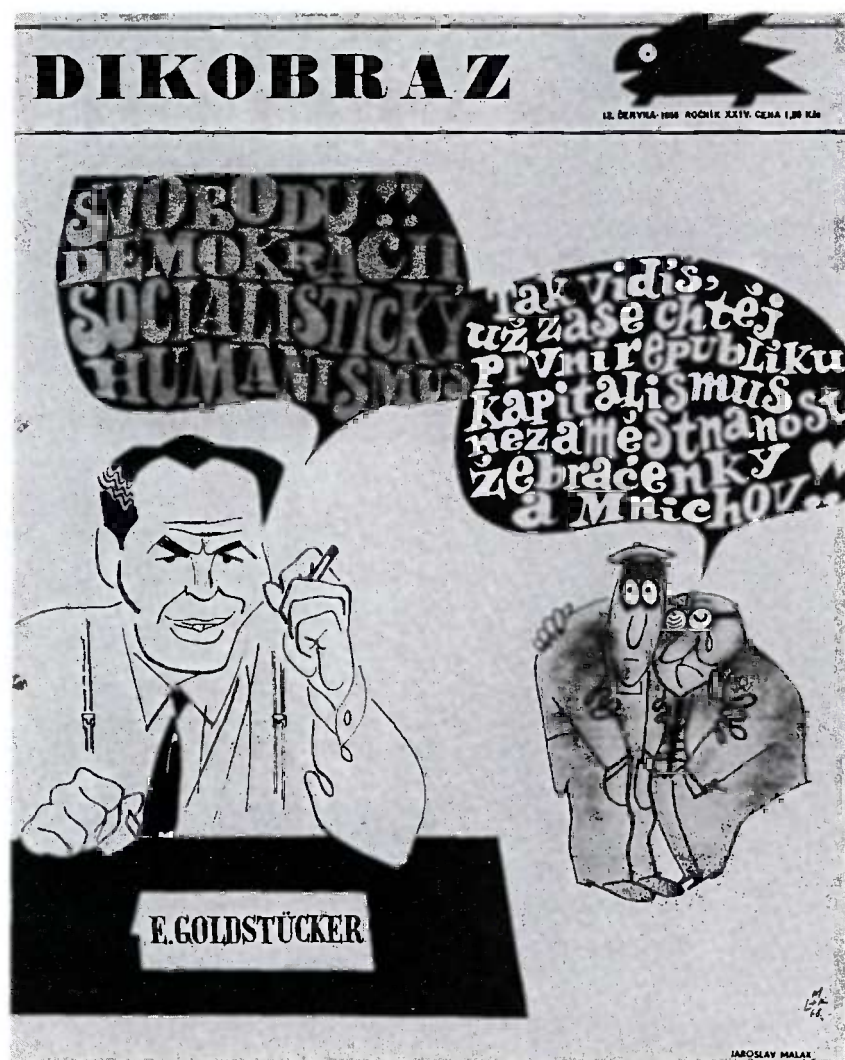

Prague Spring '68

IDC's *Prague Spring* Project is based on a thorough analysis of the events which culminated in the Soviet-led invasion of Czechoslovakia in August 1968. The selection of materials included in the project follows two main criteria: an evaluation of the origins of the reform movement and its eventual break-down; and a chronological, in some ways unique, description of the actual events.

Accordingly, the project features dailies and periodicals covering all spheres of social life ranging from the two important communist party dailies *Rude Pravo* (Czech) and *Pravda* (Slovak), economic publications such as *Hospodarske Noviny* (Economic Newspaper), or *Zemedska Ekonomika* (Agricultural Economy), to a number of relatively little-known, though important, military periodicals such as the *A Revue*. Publications of all legal political parties (both Czech and Slovak) were included to illustrate the sudden, though limited, development of political life in the country. Heavy emphasis was put on various cultural publications, both general and specialized, as artists played a key role in the reform efforts of the Prague Spring. To provide an insight that is as complete as possible into the events of 1968, even satirical magazines, such as *Dikobraz* (Czech) and *Rohac* (Slovak), are among the materials offered. Another aim of the project is to concentrate not just on events in the Czechoslovak capital itself, but also to focus on the regions. For this reason a number of Czech and Slovak regional dailies are included in the list.

The selection of publications covers a period ranging from early 1967 to late 1969. This applies only to a limited number of the periodicals included, namely those which appear to illustrate well the climate in which pressure for reform developed, and those which document the beginning of the infamous *normalization period* which followed the invasion of Czechoslovakia in August 1968.

The *Prague Spring* Project offers a balanced survey of the events of 1968 and can be considered a basic tool for the understanding of the *normalization period* and the eventual emergence of the *Velvet Revolution* in November 1989.
